The History behind the 100 years of OHH:

One of the nation's top planning and placemaking firms has called Kansas City home for 100 years. Ochsner Hare & Hare, the longest continuously operating landscape architecture firm in the U.S., is celebrating its centennial of service this year. At the core of firm services is creating legendary places here and around the world through planning and landscape architecture.

Much of the work of the founding firm, landscape architects Hare & Hare, is at the heart of what most Kansas Citians call home. In 1913, the firm partnered with the J.C. Nichols Company to create iconic neighborhoods and public places that shape the cultural landscape of Kansas City-places like the Country Club Plaza, Loose Park, the Nelson-Atkins Museum of Art, Mission Hills and the Country Club District neighborhoods along Ward Parkway. The firm was noted for its work with cemeteries, parks and boulevards, neighborhoods and institutional campuses. The firm's first big planning project was in 1922, when it teamed with George Kessler and J.C. Nichols to plan the new 14,000 acre seaport town of Longview, Washington. This project established its reputation in the field of planning.

Hare & Hare worked closely for many years with Kansas City planner Ralph Ochsner, who ultimately added his expertise to the firm by purchasing it in 1979. As a result, the planning practice was expanded throughout the Midwest and south central states.

Ochsner Hare & Hare has completed nearly 100 comprehensive plans, helping communities large and small. Its planning portfolio also includes destination retail land planning, subdivision design, corridor studies and planning, neighborhood planning and revitalization, parks

and trails, mixed use, special districts, codes revisions, zoning and all other aspects of planning. The firm has established its expertise in helping communities apply economic incentives to achieve planning goals. Often, the firm is retained to help with implementation with some projects continuing for 15 years or more.

The firm currently is completing comprehensive plans, designing signature parks, working with developers on award winning destination retail, replanning corridors, updating zoning ordinances, preparing design guidelines, working to revive historic neighborhoods and preparing to offer the region a 100th anniversary symposium celebrating placemaking on May 6. The symposium will bring internationally-known placemaking expert Fred Kent, Project for Public Spaces, to Kansas City along with national presidents of American Planning Association and American Society of Landscape Architects.
