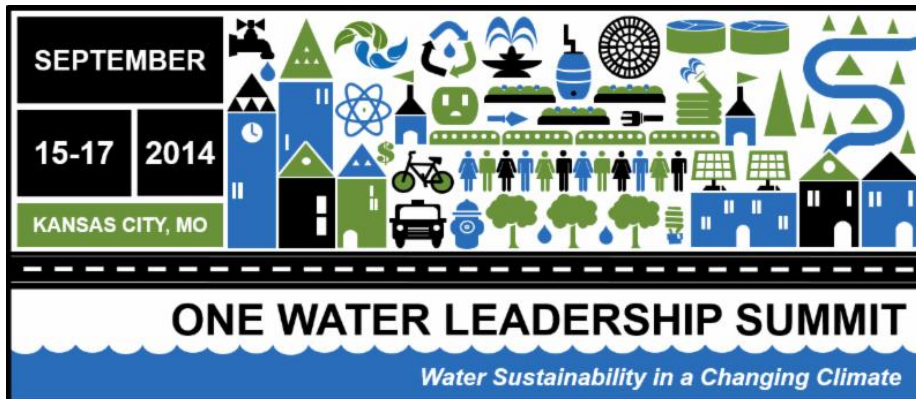
This is a fun event for professionals and students to get together outside of our offices and classrooms. Students who attend will meet KC APA board members and learn about the benefits of being involved in APA.
